



Fall Meeting at Hopkins Farm
Sunday, October 8, 2023, 2 p.m.



Join the Greenville County Historical Society for a presentation and tour of the Battle of Great Cane Brake. Hopkins Farm is listed on the National Register of Historic Places and is one of Upstate South Carolina's most significant sites. Located on a Cherokee trading path crossing the Reedy River near present-day Simpsonville, this historic farm was originally Toney's Store, a trading post for Native Americans and backwoods settlers. The Battle of Great Cane Brake was fought on December 22, 1775, between Patriot militia and

Loyalists and was the only Revolutionary War engagement in Greenville County.

Admission is free.



Noted military historian and battlefield preservationist, Durant Ashmore, will present the story of the battle as part of his 2023 lecture series on the Revolutionary War in South Carolina. A tour of the farm and the site of the battle will follow the presentation.
